- •1998 Florida wildfire season
- Chief's review of SRS/Region 8
- •Growing recognition of interface research and information needs
- Southern Wildland-Urban Interface Council





Areas or zones where increased human influence and land conversion are changing natural resource goods, services, and management.

#### Purpose

To provide a foundation for establishing an interdisciplinary program of research and technology transfer within the USDA FS Southern Research Station and Region

- •Understand the effects to forest ecology, natural resource management, and social systems.




#### Objectives
